FOUR DAYS OF TRAINING: Sign-Up and Learn Theraplay and The Marschak Interaction Method Assessment (MIM)

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Theraplay is short-term, structured therapy that focuses on enhancing attachments. It promotes self-esteem, language, behavioral, and social skills and enhances relationships between significant others. Professionals around the world are trained in Theraplay, and may use it with a single child, an entire family, or groups of children in a variety of settings, including: attachment therapy for foster/adopted children, trauma and abuse victims, children with behavioral and developmental problems, and groups, such as schools and residential treatment facilities.

The Marschak Interaction Method Assessment (MIM) is a structured technique for observing and assessing the relationship between two individuals, such as biological parent and child, foster or adoptive parent and child, supportive caregiver and child. It consists of a series of simple tasks designed to elicit a range of behaviors in four dimensions.

PROGRAM CONTENT

- Principles of attachment theory on an intellectual and experiential level.
- The Four Dimensions of Theraplay.
- The Theraplay protocol.
- An introduction to MIM: administration, analysis and as a guide for treatment planning.
- Adapting Theraplay for working with children and families impacted by complex trauma and other populations.
- Managing resistance throughout the treatment process.
- Managing countertransference in your work with children and families.
- Implementing Theraplay into your practice.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Administer the MIM and analyze it at a beginning level.
- List three goals to be achieved during a MIM feedback session with parents.
- Utilize the MIM as a guide for treatment planning.
- Describe the four dimensions of Theraplay, a modality of play therapy.
- Demonstrate one activity from each dimension: structure, engagement, nurture and challenge.
- Describe three possible ways of adapting Theraplay treatment to meet the needs of a child with complex trauma.
- Describe how to guide parents to participate in Theraplay treatment session.
